

The government says that Relationships education has to be taught in all primary schools.

Sex education does not have to be taught in primary schools, only secondary schools.

Parents and carers cannot withdraw their child from any relationships or health education but they can still ask that their child is withdrawn from some parts of sex education but not any that is taught in science lessons.

Children who have sex education at school know the real facts and make better choices than children who hear things from their friends or see it on TV etc.
