We have previously worked with the brilliant team at AFCL (Adult, Family and Community Learning) to offer in school family learning sessions for parents. Courses include Story Sacks, Fun with Phonics, Magic Maths and they can tailor these to the needs of our school and parents. Courses are held in school and run for 5 or 6 weeks.
